Our Mission

To provide a safe, academic, energizing, and active After School and Summer Camp Program within an atmosphere based on Christian values and principles and to meet children at their level of development. We will share with them the joy of knowing, growing, and showing God's love. We will equip them with the knowledge and tools to stand firm in a challenging world.

Our Goal

Our goal is to provide opportunities for your children to grow physically, mentally, and spiritually through our Christian based program.

Staff Expectations

We have some requirements that our staff must meet, and we also have some expectations of our staff. The following may give you some insight into what type of leadership we strive to have here at Bethel Baptist Church After School & Summer Camp Program.

- . Staff must have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ.
- . Staff must have a desire and passion to work with children.
- . We expect our staff to be on time to work and be ready for each day.
- . We expect our staff to set examples by wearing clean, neat After School & Summer Camp Program T-shirts etc. and their name tags every day.

We expect our staff to display proper attitudes toward the children, other staff, and parents.

We expect our staff to realize that the After School & Summer Camp Program is not just another program. It is a ministry of Bethel Baptist Church and an environment for the children to learn in a program based on Christian values and principles.

Our Staff has had comprehensive Background Checks through South Carolina Department of Social Services which includes SLED/FBI Fingerprint Checks, State Abuse & Neglect Checks and State & National Sex Offender Checks.

Our staff are certified in Pediatric First Aid, Infant/Child CPR, AED Machine and EPI Pen Administration.

Our staff are required to obtain 15 hours of training annually and the Program Director is required to obtain 20 hours annually. These trainings include but are not limited to Health & Safety and Blood Borne Pathogens.

We Strive to Provide

A safe and nurturing learning environment... Learning is not necessarily the ABC's and 123's. It is also learning of values, honesty, respect, self-reliance, self-potential, self-discipline, moderation, and the values of being dependable. Christian values, sensitivity to others, kindness, friendliness, fairness and giving are what we strive to provide.

A proper approach to discipline... Since children occasionally need discipline, it is important that we share a similar philosophy. So that your child is not confused as to where the boundaries are and what is expected

of him/her. Children are taught which behaviors are inappropriate, why, and given alternatives that are acceptable. In this way, the behavior is being changed, without making the child feel “bad” or unloved. This helps develop their self-esteem and teaches them how to handle difficult situations themselves in the future. We express our disapproval (without attacking character). We state our expectations and show your child how to make amends. In extreme situations a child may be given a “time out” because at times they may be having trouble making good choices on their own and may need a couple of minutes to calm down and think about their choices.

And to foster unconditional love... This kind of love is important to use because children should not grow up feeling that for them to be loved and cared for, they must meet numerous conditions.

Communication is key to a successful After School and Summer Camp Program. The Parents and Program Director need to have a good working relationship so they can communicate and work together. Parents and Program Director need to exchange pertinent information in the child’s life such as changes in routine, special events, or activities, as well as changes such as death, divorce, separation, moving, visitors, etc. All this information can be important in understanding the child’s feelings, behavior, and well-being.

We invite you to share with us in writing, by telephone, or schedule an appointment to talk about your concerns in any area that you feel we need improving and we will do our best to improve in that area.

Enrollment In the Program

Bethel Baptist Church After School and Summer Camp Program will not discriminate by ethnicity, race, gender, nationality, origin, or creed. To enroll please submit:

- Complete Registration Form for each Child
- Complete Medical Authorization Form if taking medication
- Parent Consent Form
- Copy of your Child’s Certificate of Immunization Record
- Completed the Brightwheel Draft Information

The Bethel Baptist After School and Summer Camp Program reserves the right to deny after school/summer camp services if one or more of the following conditions exist:

- The child is not participating in or benefiting from the program.
- The staff cannot provide adequate or safe care for the child.
- The staff cannot provide adequate or safe care to other children due to the behaviors of a child.
- If the child is being picked up late from the program after 6:20 on a reoccurring basis.

Child’s Health

A copy of the child’s immunization records is required to have on file. Parent/Guardian must complete a medical form for your child and if your child is taking any medications. We will need a medication authorization form filled out. It is up to the parents to update all forms, as necessary. Should your child have signs or symptoms requiring exclusion from the After School & Summer Camp Program he/she will be isolated, and the parent/guardian or other persons authorized by the parent will be notified immediately to pick up your child. There will be no exceptions since illness spreads quickly among children. Please make

other arrangements if your child is sick and respect our decision if we deem your child too sick to attend the After School & Summer Camp Program. We are sympathetic to the difficulties of taking time off work so discretion will be used.

The symptoms of illness for possible exclusion shall include and are not limited to any of the following or if the illness prevents your child from participating comfortably in the childcare program.

The child has any of the following conditions:

- Temperature: 100 degrees or greater; need to stay home until they are fever free for 24 hours without using fever-reducing medicine or accompanied by behavior changes or other signs or symptoms of illness, until medical evaluation indicates inclusion in the facility.
- Signs and symptoms of possible severe illness (such as unusual lethargy [sluggish behavior], uncontrolled coughing, irritability, persistent crying, difficult breathing, wheezing, or other unusual signs), until medical evaluation allows inclusion.
- Uncontrolled diarrhea.
- Vomiting illness (two or more episodes of vomiting in the previous 24 hours) until vomiting resolves or until a health care provider determines the illness to be non-communicable, and the child is not a danger of dehydration.
- Mouth sores with drooling, unless a health care provider or health official determines the condition is noninfectious.
- Rash with fever or behavior change, until a health care provider determines that these symptoms do not indicate a communicable disease.
- Purulent conjunctivitis (defines as pink or red conjunctiva with white or yellow eye discharge), until 24 hours after treatment has been initiated.
- Scabies, head lice, ring worm, or other infestation, until 24 hours after treatment has been initiated.
- Strep throat or other streptococcal infection, until 24 hours after initial antibiotic treatment and cessation of fever.
- Unspecified respiratory illness if it limits the child's comfortable participation in activities or if it results in a need for greater care that can be provided without compromising the health and safety of other children.
- If your child has been sent home from school for an illness and can not go back to school for a certain number of days, they cannot come to the after school or summer camp program until they are cleared by a Dr. and are able to return to school.

Typical Activities

Homework: A time where we help children with their schoolwork, reading assignments, virtual learning, etc.

Free Play: Children are given the opportunity to choose an activity.

Outdoor play: (Weather permitting) swinging, climbing, running, playing on the playground, playing ball, etc. (Please remember to dress your child appropriately for the weather, if in doubt, dress in layers or bring extra clothes.

Arts & Crafts: A chance for your child to be creative and experience their art/craft skills and a time to learn and experience something new.

Group play: Team Building, Devotion Group Games, etc.

Stem: Science, Technology, Engineering, Math

Special Days: Staff and Children's Birthdays/Holiday Parties, Observing Holidays, etc.

After School Extra Activities or Before School Care

Bethel Baptist After School and Summer Camp Program will, if necessary, provide a separate pickup service for your child for after school activities and before school. If you need this service for your child understand there is a \$20.00 extra charge per day per child for this service.

After School and Summer Camp Necessities

To insure your child's health and happiness we suggest that you provide an insulated water bottle for them. We will have a water cooler where they will be able to refill their bottles every day. **Understand if your child does not provide a water bottle after 1 week in the after-school program or summer camp program your child will be provide with a water bottle that will be kept at the site and we will charge you a fee of \$15.00 to buy a water bottle for your child.** We will provide sunscreen for your child during the summer. If your child requires special sunscreen you will need to provide the sunscreen along with a medical form filled out and we will keep it in our first aid supply box for safe keeping. A change of clothing labelled with your child's name to be kept in case of accidents or spills.

What not to Bring to After school or Summer Camp

Knives, weapons, alcohol, drugs, gum, tobacco products, expensive jewelry, toys, radios, air pods, electronic games, cell phones, CD players, makeup, playing cards, etc. Please leave these items at home. Camp Program along with the staff and Program Director will not be responsible for anything that is stolen or broken that is brought by the children. If your child needs to bring a cell phone, we ask that it be placed in our phone box until your child is picked up. If your child continually brings items that are disruptive to the program you will be dismissed from the After School or Summer Camp Program.

Homework

Homework time is mandatory. Children are asked during this time to spread out and do not sit with their friends until their homework is completed. There will be no games played on the iPad or other devices during this time. All homework needs to be assigned by the teacher and be due on the following day. Children who have reading assignments must choose a book, reading will not be done on electronic devices. Make up work is something that you will need to complete at home with your child. All staff will check all their assignments the teacher has assigned to them for that day. Each child will have 45 minutes to complete homework while the staff monitor and assist the children, however if your child has more homework than that time allows extra time will be given. Understand that if your child does not have any homework, we will provide them something to work on. If your child says that they have no homework, we will ask him/her to show their assignments to make sure their work has been completed.

Cyberbullying:

Bethel Baptist Church After School and Summer Camp Program would rather you keep your child's electronics at home. If your child has a cell phone that is ok, but it will be kept in their book bag. While your child is at Bethel Baptist Church during the After School and Summer Camp Program, the parent will do all communications through the Program Director this way if there is any issue, we can resolve the problem as soon as it starts. There is so much out there now and the last thing we want is your child having to deal with something through social media.

It is mandatory that parents sign up in the Brightwheel System.

The After School and Summer Camp Program uses an App called Brightwheel where parents are expected to check their child in and out daily. Everything will be entered into the Brightwheel System such as activities, temperature, snack, incident report, etc. The Brightwheel System will also be used for all financial transactions and announcements to parents.

Enrollment/Payment Agreement

Registration fee is \$65.00 per child, this is paid when your child signs up for our program. Payment for your child's tuition is due on Friday for the prior week for each child. All fees must be paid by credit/debit card draft set up through the Brightwheel System. In the event of a declined credit/debit card a payment fee of \$20.00 will be assessed per child if payment is not received before Monday morning. Parents you will need to let the Program Director know what is going on with the payment. If the parent does not let the Program Director know and we do not receive the payment by 5:00pm Monday evening, we will not pick up your child up at school until payment is made. There will be a \$50.00 fee for all returned checks. You will be responsible for all overdraft fees from your bank and any fees incurred by Bethel Baptist Church Afterschool and Summer Camp Program that are related to this transaction. Understand your child's spot has been secured in our After School and Summer Camp Program and payment is your responsibility. There are no deductions in weekly fees for absences. **Parents agree to automatic bank drafts each week through the Brightwheel System. Understand when you sign your child up with our program to participate in the combo price for After School and Summer Camp your child needs to already be in the After School Program with us to get the discount provided. If this is your first year and you want to sign them up for Summer Camp and After School, you will have to do Summer Camp first and then sign up for After School closer to the school year.**

Refund Policy

The After School and Summer Camp Program does not provide any refunds.

Referral and Discount Policy

If you refer other children to our After School or Summer Camp Program, you will get \$20 off your tuition after the referred child has been established in the program which includes a paid registration fee and attending the program for 1 month. To ensure credit for the referral please make sure your child's name is included on the registration forms of the child that is being referred.

Field Trips

During field trips, children must always remain with their counselor. If at any time your child purposely wanders away from their counselor, they will not be allowed to attend the next field trip. If this continues to be a problem, it could lead to expulsion.

Make sure your child arrives at Bethel Baptist Church at least 1 hour before field trip time. Children arriving late and missing the bus will need to be taken back home, as there will be no one at the site to watch the child. Parents do not bring your child to us at the field trip site. We can not accept your child that day after the bus has already left Bethel Baptist Church.

Release of Children

It is important that we protect your child by ensuring that your child does not leave our facility with a person you have not authorized on your pick-up list in the Brightwheel System. If an emergency happens, we must have your permission to release your child to someone other than the parents, so parents will need to send us a text message or an email, so we have a written consent. We will need the person's name and a description of what he/she looks like. The person picking up your child will have to show us a picture ID before we will release your child from our care. Understand it is up to the parents to update all authorized pick-up people on your list. If they are not on the list and we cannot contact the parent, they will not be released to that person, for your child's safety we cannot have anyone picking your child up under the age of 18 years old and must have a valid driver's licenses.

Both parents have the right to pick up your child. Parents can give the Program Director or Lead Staff Member a copy of a court order stating otherwise. We will need to discuss how we should handle the non-custodial parent who arrives to pick up your child. Without a copy of the court order, we cannot refuse a parent. If we have a court order and a non-custodial parent tries to pick up the child, we will immediately call the police and report the situation. We will not place the other children at risk in a confrontation with the non-custodial parent.

It is especially important to us that your child arrives home safely. Therefore, if the person who arrives to pick up your child appears intoxicated or otherwise incapable of bringing your child home safely, we will call the parent first and then if there is no response, we will call the emergency contacts listed in the Brightwheel System.

Intoxication

Your child's safety is our priority. If a Staff member believes than an authorized person from your child's pick-up list is intoxicated or not able to drive your child home safely. We will detain the child until an alternate plan can be arranged for the transportation of the child and their parent.

Safety

For your child's safety we have many protocols that the Program Director and Staff will follow. Bethel Baptist Church is locked to outside guests while our After School and Summer Camp Program is occupying the building. The children and staff will practice the following drills to keep your child safe:

Fire Drill

Intruder Drill

Tornado Drill

Bad Weather/Severe Thunderstorm

Bus Safety (procedures are reviewed and practiced)

Any other emergency routines that may occur.

We practice with the children proper Bathroom and Hand Washing Routines.

Our After School and Summer Camp Program is serious in following COVID safety procedures which includes thoroughly cleaning of the facility and buses to ensure the safety of the children in our After School and Summer Camp Program.

Days of Operation

The After School and Summer Camp Program will operate Monday through Friday each week. After School runs from 2:20pm until 6:20pm. On certain school holidays, teacher workdays, spring break, ABC learning modules, and our Summer Camp Program will operate 7:00am until 6:20pm each day.

Holidays and Closings

The program will be closed on the following days:

Thanksgiving Day, The day after Thanksgiving, Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, and the day after Christmas, New Year's Eve, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, and Labor Day.

Weather Delays/Closings

No refunds or discounts will be granted due to weather related closings. Should school dismiss early, we will pick up and transport children to Bethel Baptist Church providing the schools allow dismissal to After School Programs. Parents must pick up their child within 2 hours of the school's closing. During extended weather school closings, if roads are safe enough for our staff to arrive, we will open on a delay. **You will receive notice through the Brightwheel System.**

Policies and Procedures

If illness or other emergencies should arise with your child, parents will receive a phone call and a text message to pick up your child or plan on other arrangements with someone on your authorized pick-up list. Parents will need to provide the family code word to whoever is picking up their child, please let the Program Director know if special arrangements are made for someone other than the parent to pick-up your child. It is mandatory to include all people with permission to pick-up your child in the Brightwheel System.

If Your Child is Absent:

If your child is not going to be at school or is not coming to our facility that day the parents will need to send the Program Director a message and let us know. You can text Lisa Thornburg (Program Director) at 704-214-2892 or send her an email lisa@bbclw.org or message through the Brightwheel System. This will be extremely helpful in keeping our fuel for the buses down and helps the bus driver and the head staff riding the bus with the bus driver know which children we are picking up that day and we are not holding up the line looking for your child. If you fail to let the Program Director know and we expect to pick up your child at the school repeatedly, you will be charged a \$10.00 fuel fee per child on your account.

Discipline

We express our disapproval (without attacking character). We state our expectations and show your child how to make amends. We give choices, and in extreme situations a child may be given a "time out" because at times a child may be having trouble making good choices on their own and they just may need a couple of minutes to calm down and think about their choices. In some cases, we will write your child up and work on a behavior plan. Our goal is to provide a safe, positive, fun Christian environment where children may achieve their greatest God-given potential. Our role is to give positive redirection, positive encouragement, helpful discussions that point out correct/desired behaviors, providing on incident report what our role was in helping the child to learn from the situation.

Steps we take in the Behavior Management Protocol:

- 1st Infraction will result in a warning.
- 2nd Infraction will result in conversation with parent and child that explains their choices and how they can work on them.
- 3rd Infraction your child will be written up.
- 4th Infraction your child will receive a 1-day suspension from the After School or Summer Camp Program.
- 5th Infraction the child and their parent will meet with the program Director and draw up a behavior action plan. This action plan will list details of a plan to improve the behavior that warranted the concern. The behavior action plan will have a time frame to achieve the goal. If the child gets another write-up during the behavior action plan, your child may be withdrawn from the program automatically.

Depending on the nature and severity of the infraction/behavior the Program Director will have the right to skip certain steps in the behavior management protocol.

Gross Misconduct

The Program Director will communicate to the parent immediately if your child is frequently and deliberately causing harm to others and is frequently and deliberately being destructive. This behavior is unsafe and will not be allowed and immediate termination will ensure if the behavior persists.

Sick Policy

24 Hour Rule- Please do not send your child to Bethel Baptist Church After School and Summer Camp Program with the following in the last 24 hours.

- Dizziness
- Fever
- Rash of unknown origin
- Persistent cough
- Vomiting/Diarrhea
- Strep Throat

Before returning, your child must not have a fever in 24 hours without taking medication to reduce fever.

Child's Medication

A "Medication log" **must** accompany all medication given to the children at Bethel Baptist Church After School and Summer Camp Program. Over the counter medication is usually given for short term health conditions; the average length of time is 5 days.

We will need an authorization form to apply sunscreen to your child while they attend the program. It is vital to understand that sunscreen (spray on preferably) is a necessity when it comes to Summer Camp as well as a water bottle.

Prescribed medication by a doctor should be administered by the parent at home, if the medication needs to be taken during the After School and Summer Camp Program, Parents will need to make sure the medication is in the original pharmacy bottle and must be dated in the past 30 days and must have the information below. Under no circumstance are children allowed to administer their own medication.

- Child's name
- Date
- Doctor's name and phone number
- Pharmacist name and phone number
- Name of medication
- Dosage amounts and times to be administered.
- Route of medication, i.e., oral, eye, etc.
- What medication is for?
- Date medication is to end.
- Special directions, i.e., take before eating, etc.
- Parent's Signature

Medications are kept in a locked box.

Dress Code

Children need to dress appropriately as we are an active program. Make sure if your child wears a dress it comes to the knee and shorts are worn underneath it. We recommend your child wears closed toe shoes or sneakers. This will help prevent injuries and make it a lot easier on your child to do the activities we have planned for that day. If your child needs to change for a sport or etc. Please let the program director know and make sure you provide clothes and the time they need to be ready so we can help keep your kids be ready when you arrive.

It is suggested that we have an extra set of clothes on site for each child. If your child has an accident in which any bodily fluid is on their clothing they will need to change and without extra clothes for them to change into the parent will be contacted for early pickup.

Property and Equipment Damages

Parents are financially responsible for intentional damage and external damages to all equipment, facilities, buses, and field trip properties.

Swimming

Each child will be required to take a swim agility test.

Children should come dressed simply to make changing as easy as possible.

On swim days staff will be especially devoted to vigilance and the safety of the children. Sunscreen and hats are recommended for protection against the sun.

Nutrition

Your child will be provided a snack after school each day. During holidays, virtual learning, and summer camp your child will be provided a morning and afternoon snack. On full days for virtual learning or summer camp your child will need to bring a lunch each day. If your child has allergies, please inform us. Parents may also want to provide a safe nutritious snack for your child.

If your child has a special diet, parents may provide snacks that adhere to said diet. If a parent provides snacks for their child, the snack must be given to the Program Director in a container labeled with the child's name on it.

Transportation

Your child will be picked up at school each day by the Bethel Baptist Church Buses, so please go over the importance of staying seated and keeping the noise level to a minimum while your children are on the bus. During the bus ride to our location, children are to keep all items in their bookbags, so nothing is lost or damaged or left on the bus. Staff is not allowed to transport children in the personal vehicles. Make sure your child knows that they need to be ready to go when the bus pulls up to get them, we cannot wait on your child, if we have to wait on your child, it holds up the other buses and makes the bus late arriving at other schools for pick-up. If your child keeps being late and holding the bus up you have to pick your child up from school and bring them to the site.

Babysitting the Children

Staff are not allowed to babysit the children outside of the program. It is a conflict of interest. We do not want to show favoritism and want all the kids to feel equal in our program.

Photograph Release

Children may be photographed during After School and Summer Camp Program activities to report to donors and for promotional purposes. The child's identity will not be disclosed if photos are used for advertising or any other means. All photos taken are the sole property of Bethel Baptist Church After School and Summer Camp Program.

Carowinds Season Passes

Season Pass for Summer Camp to Carowinds Pre K-thru Middle School will need to be purchased by the parents through Carowinds if you do not have one already. We will need the purchased active season pass on the first day of summer camp. Carowinds offers a Free Pk pass for children ages 3 to 5 years old. You will need to purchase the meal plan for each child you have enrolled in the program. Purchasing the meal plan will save you a lot of money if you do not get the meal plan you will need around \$30.00 each day, we go to Carowinds just for lunch for each child enrolled in the program. There will be no need to purchase the Carowinds cups, the children should always bring a water bottle to Bethel Baptist After School and Summer Camp Program which will be taken to Carowinds each time.

Pick Up

After School and Summer Camp ends at 6:20pm. We ask that you contact the program director as soon as possible if an emergency prohibits you from being on time to pick up your child or if being late is unavoidable due to traffic or weather. If you do not pick up your child before 6:20pm you will be charged \$1.00 per minute per child. There will be an additional fee of \$10.00 per child if you do not contact the Program Director before 6:20pm to let us know you will be late.

Cancellation Policy

Parent/Guardian will give two weeks written notice that enrollment in program is being terminated. If a two-week notice is not given, you are financially obligated for the two weeks of childcare fees and late payment. Bethel Baptist Church After School and Summer Camp are here to help you and provide a safe and active program at an affordable rate for the parents. In return we ask that you please understand and follow this guide to help us keep providing an affordable program for your children.

A Few Final Thoughts

As a parent in our After School and Summer Camp Program please...

Take an interest in your child's activities and development in our program, care and share your child's habits, fear, and concerns with us.

Read all correspondence given in writing, texted or posted in the Brightwheel System.

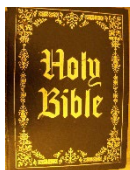
